




## Author Diane Frankenstein Helps Jump-start the Habit of Reading

"I realized early on in my career that children like to talk about stories," Diane says. "Talking to them about stories builds their confidence to become good readers."

As a springboard, Diane will be using her new book, *Reading Together: Everything You Need to Know to Raise a Child Who Loves to Read* (Perigree Books, 2009). But, she quickly adds, there are countless other books that will work just as well to ignite the literacy spark. "The secret is to find the home-run book that your child wants to talk about with you," she says. "My book is not a how-to. It offers ideas and guidelines to initiate conversations and to get your kids thinking critically—through books—about important, age-old questions: 'What does it mean to be a good friend?' 'What does it mean to leave the world a little better than you found it?' There's more power in the questions than in the answers. Everyone comes to his or her own answers. They are inside of us."
